Employment Assistance

SNAPET/Employment Assistance

The goal of SNAPET is to provide opportunities for job search and job training to become no longer dependent on food stamps. The program is open to individuals who are not also receiving Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF). At this time, the program targets single adults living alone. Registrants are referred to the SNAPET program at the time of food stamp application, reapplication and every 12 months thereafter unless a change occurs that affects exemption status. Clients in the program may participate in job search, job readiness training, and/or unpaid work experience, which may serve to make them more employable. Supportive services may include child day care, transportation, and medical/dental services.
